PLANTS ON THE ROOF? YOU BET!

Come see the many different forms this technology can take: on garages, carports, studio offices and even a chicken coop, and learn about the various green roof systems and their benefits. The tour is **self-guided**: choose your own pace and the roofs you want to see. Each location will have folks on hand to answer questions.

From 10am to 2pm, explore 5 green roofs in north Seattle neighborhoods. From 2pm-5pm, the tour moves to south Seattle for two more green roofs.

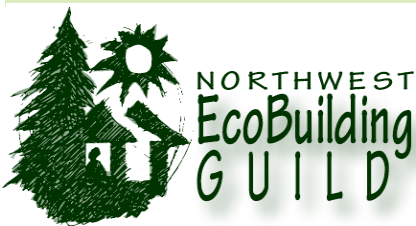
Tickets and maps: Available from 10am-noon at the north starting point, and from 2-3pm at the south starting point. Tickets purchased from 10am-noon are good for both north and south end tours; tickets purchased at the south end are good only for the south end tour. Cash or check only. Price is \$10 (\$5 for NW EcoBuilding Guild members). All proceeds benefit the Green Roof Project's educational outreach.

SEE SEVEN GREEN ROOFS, ALL WITHIN THE SEATTLE CITY LIMITS!

Directions to 10am starting point in the Sunset Hill Neighborhood: From I-5, go **west** on 85th Street to 31st Ave. NW (3.6 miles). Take a **right** on 31st and go one block. Take a **left** on 87th Street and go one short block to Forest Hill Pl. NW and take a **right**. The starting point is the 2nd house on the left: **8709 Forest Hill Pl. NW**

Directions to 2pm starting point in the Mt. Baker Neighborhood: From the North, go **south** on Rainier Ave S. Turn **left** (east) on S. McClellan St. and drive about 6 blocks. Turn **right** (south) on Mount Baker Blvd at the flashing overhead red stop light. Drive about a half block to a dogleg left and follow it for another half block. Look on your left for a green house on a steep hill - MIND THE STEPS! If you hit South Hanford St., you have gone too far. **2970 36th Ave. S**
